#### R. sinofalconeri

About the last of the larger leafed rhododendron species to flower at Emu Valley is R. sinofalconeri. Our plants have been flowering for the last 3 years, this year having the best display yet. The rich, yellow flowers have a small red blotch at the base inside the flower and are held in a large rounded truss of 24-28 oblique-campanulate flowers and show a marked resemblance to the earlier flowered R. macabeanum and its Himalayan cousin R. falconeri. The large elliptic leaves are matt green and slightly bullate on the upper surface with a thick brown indumentum underneath.

Augustine Henry collected R. sinofalconeri about 1898 on the northern mountain slopes at Mengtz, Yunnan. In the early 1990s Keith Rushforth and Tom Hudson collected from south of the Red River in Vietnam and in 1995 Peter Cox and Steve Hootman sourced it from the Yunnan-Vietnam border. We met Peter Cox some years back (our Patron Kenneth Cox is his son) and Steve Hootman from the Species Foundation in U.S.A. visited more recently, which makes it more real and exciting. It is recorded as being a tree of around 6 meters, with a strong growth habit.

At Emu Valley our plants are around 1.5 meters in height and can be viewed from the road to the Chinese Pavilion on the left hand side in Yunnan. A much admired plant and a great addition to our collection. *Maurie & Pam*
