IN MY GARDEN by Lesley Gillanders



I really thought I would not write this article in time. I will not be able to get inspiration from a quick walk in the garden. But from my hospital bed, with a good mental picture, I will give it a go. Ken tells me there are nice little flowers on a small daffodil until a snail found them, but not to be dismayed there are two more buds coming. It is *Narcissus cantabricus petunioides*, a little charmer. When Ken comes to visit each day my first question is "How are you?" followed by "What is in flower in the garden?".

A large patch of *Galanthus plicatus* gently swaying in the breeze makes a pretty picture. Unfortunately the same cannot be said for the strong winds over the last few days. There is a considerable difference in the size of the flowers in the *Galanthus* family. Our smallest one is *G nivalis*, a delightful species, and we also have the double flowered form *flora pleno*. *G. gracilis* and *G. rizehensis*. All have the



sunshine at the back of the house with not one flower. Ken says he will give them a drink.

Iris reticulata has several flowers open and different forms of it will flower in the next week - "George" is outstanding with its large flowers.



typical three petals with an inner tube which is sometimes green or with individual green markings. Some of the larger flowered ones we have are <u>*G. caucasicus*</u>, <u>*G. plicatus*</u> and <u>*G. "S. Arnott"*</u>.

The *Eranthis* are making a good sized clump at the front of the house, they have to contend with some well grown *Cyclamen hederifolium*. There is a tub of them in full



A new flower for us after losing it many years ago is *Cyclamen pseudibericum*. The leaves have a pewter sheen to them, and the flowers are scented and deep carmine. The first of the *Narcissus cyclamineus* are open, and in another week there will be a patch open near the creek. It is a sweet little daffodil with its turned back petals.

At Longley we could not grow *Lachenalias* as it was too cold. Here in Kingston we have a few flowers open on *L. pendula* and *L. quadricolor.*





Anyone with a plant of *Daphne bholua* will appreciate the intense fragrance of its flowers opening in mid winter. We have two plants 2 m high in full bloom, one near the greenhouse and the other on the side garden. Some trusses are open on *Rhododendron* "Cornubia". The strong winds wrecked the early ones but more are opening now. It is in the front garden where we lost R. "Taurus" a couple of years ago.

Camellia reticulata is also flowering there with lovely large red flowers.

If I get home from hospital I will type this article myself, if not Ken will type it. He will not guarantee to get it right, with no spelling mistakes, no italics for plant names but I am sure he will do a good job.
