IN MY GARDEN by Lesley Gillanders

As I write these notes today, it seems ridiculous to say thank goodness the rain has stopped but at least the garden has benefited from the past few wet weeks. Now we are enjoying a little taste of spring and our garden has so much colour, it is hard to know which plants to mention. One of the simplest and common plants are *Dianthus*. There is one un named plant in the side garden which is a mass of pink flowers with a carmine red eye. It has grown into a silvery grey dome shape. Nearby is a little *Viola* with pretty pansy flowers of creamy yellow with a mauve edge. It has seeded across the garden with a variety of different shades, even a blue purple. The pleasing thing is it seems to be perennial as we have had it for a number of years.

There are ground cover alpine *Phlox* making a carpet of colour. We have *P.*'Daniel' a vigorous bright pink, *P.*'G F Wilson' in a soft blue mauve, *P.*'Temiscaming' is a rosy red, *P.*'subulata alba' is a clear white, *P.*'Amazing Grace' is also white but with a pink eye and *P.*'Tamonagalei'. This last one we brought back from a nursery in Japan several years ago. It has pretty pink and white flowers but after some time and selling it in the nursery we eventually lost it, but recently we located it being sold locally and have it again.

The *Hippeastrum papilio* which Ken raised from seed 10 years ago had one flower last year but this year there are four heads of flowers. Slugs have ruined one but the other three are now protected with pellets. The large creamy flowers with dark red markings are most attractive. Ken has just removed a very pretty pink *Thymus longicaulis* which is in full bloom, from where it was hanging over the wall beside the ramp at the back of the house and transplanted it to another part of the garden. In its place he has planted *Clematis* 'Sweet Hart' It has a mass of white flowers and will quickly spill over the edge. We imported this plant many years ago from a friend who has a nursery in the south of New Zealand but after selling it in the nursery for a long time, we eventually lost, so we were pleased to find another one at a local nursery.

An interesting *Viburnum* in flower at present is *V.sargentii* 'Onondaga'. The centre of the posy like flower is the fertile part, this is surrounded by sterile florets. Nearby on the edge of the garden is *Deutzia* 'Nakaiana'. This is a dainty little shrub covered with a



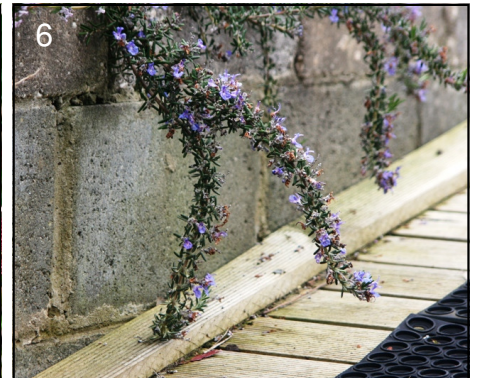

Our collection of *Rhododendron* has been increasing for some time and finally we are seeing most of them in bloom. *R.*'Saffron Queen' is a good yellow, *R.*'Point Defiance' is spectacular with huge pink and white trusses, *R.*'Spring Joy' has pretty pink flowers, *R.*'Goldfinger' is a golden colour, *R.*'Unique Marmalade' is an orange. *R.*'Loders White' has large conical trusses of white blooms. Then there are the small ones in the rock garden *R.*'Wee Bee' - pink, *R.*'June Bee' - white, *R.**campylogynum* - pink, *R.*'Curlew' - yellow, *R.*'Intrafast' - violet.

Near the side fence are two *Cantua buxifolia*. They were severely damaged by frost last year but have recovered and have produced a copious number of flowers. One is a bicolor of white and creamy yellow, The other is the brilliant rosy red form. We saw this growing in its native habitat in Bolivia, of which it is the national flower. *Paeonia peregrina* has its beautiful single red goblet shaped flowers open. They last a long time on the plant. Next to it is *P. delavayi* with smaller dark red flowers.

Ken planted a specimen of *Magnolia* 'Gold Star' in the top garden. As he had two plants of it, he planted the second one on the other side of the creek where we put some other surplus plants. This one produced a more pleasing display of flowers than the one in the house garden.

The rock garden and extended area are a mass of colour with pink *Aethionema*, purple *Aubretia*, blue *Lithodora*, various colours of *Lewisia*, a red *Gladiolus* species with small flowers to mention a few plants. At the top of the ramp is *Rosmarinus officinale*. There is one branch hanging over the edge which looks like a little man walking up the ramp. We call him Mr Rosemary. Who knows how many other "Little People" live in the garden !
