LIBRARY

PRESENTATIONS, DEMONSTRATIONS, TALKS AND MEETINGS

At the Annual General Meeting, the Society elects the committee and makes major decisions about the Society's direction. We encourage you to attend this to have your say. The date and venue are announced in the *Newsletter* and on the **website** homepage bottom righthand EVENTS. Other meetings, presentations, demonstrations of horticultural techniques, garden visits etc. are organised on an *ad hoc* basis at various venues. Demonstrations usually take place on weekends at the Dandenong Ranges Botanic Garden, and member's garden visits. Talks are organised when a speaker is available. PLANT PROPAGATION AND SALES

Following the complete overhaul of our nursery facilities at DRBG we are creating propagation lists for the next few years. The next few months is propagation time, so let us know what you are chasing, and we will endeavour to do it! Special plant sale days are held at the Dandenong Rhododendron Botanic Garden as advised in the *Newsletter* and on the **website**.

We stock plants that you cannot get elsewhere and could propagate specific rhododendrons for you if still growing in the DRBG.

Upcoming ARSV Events for 2024 Emma Moysey, ARSV Secretary

2nd of November at 2pm— ARSV Annual General Meeting open to all ARSV members. This will include a visit to Australian Cloud Forest Garden, ARSV new facilities, plant sales and a BBQ lunch.

16th of November - garden visits open to all ARSV members and free of charge.

- 10:00am Heywood House is located at 50 Linwood Road, Seville, Victoria. This will include a tour of Virginia Heywood's garden. BYO lunch. A BBQ will be available for use. This 6.5 hectare property has a few acres of garden with sweeping views of mountains and vineyards that frame the garden and is filled with many camellias, salvias, an orchard, a dam and abundant wildlife. Virginia was a political adviser in Tony Blair's cabinet while living in the UK, who turned her hand to horticulture after returning to Australia. 25 years later, Virginia is a guide at the Royal Melbourne Botanic Garden, 3CR radio gardening show presenter and Plant Trust Secretary.
- 1:30pm Geoff Bogle Arboretum is located at 770 Gembrook Launching Place Road, Hoddles Creek, Victoria. This will include a tour. The arboretum fills a 32 hectare property where Geoff started planting trees back in 1985. Today, there are over 4,000 different trees and shrubs, including more than 1750 different conifers, 230 different oaks of which 158 are species and the remainder hybrids and cultivars, 150 maples and a spread of Australin rainforest trees. Geoff was a plant enthusiast who once grew Christmas trees (conifers) for supermarkets.

Seminar on ARSV Nth Qld Rhododendron Project held 15th of June 2024 Andrew Rouse, ARSV Vice President

I held a seminar at the Ferny Creek Horticultural Society where I did a presentation and Q&A time on the ARSV North Queensland Rhododendron Project. This was also live and recorded on Zoom. The seminar had great attendance. The presentation overview covered:

- Vireya rhododendrons and their distribution and conservation status
- Australia's two endemic species of vireyas (Rhododendron lochiae and R. viriosum)
- ARSV's involvement in the Tropical Mountain Plant Science project
- Establishing a conservation collection of R. lochiae and R. viriosum at the DRBG, and
- The creation of the Australian Cloud Forest Garden.
